6. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

- Parking Passes provided to students and staff. Students must have their car registered and have a pass in their car to avoid being towed at their expense. Students are not permitted to park in the staff parking lots at any time. Students who do so may lose the privilege of parking on school property.

- Splendours of Central Europe Trip fall 2026 :This document outlines the itinerary and details for the "Splendours of Central Europe" educational tour, including destinations, activities, and inclusions.

Tour Overview

- The tour includes overnight stays in Budapest, Bratislava, Prague, Munich, and Heidelberg, with expert-led sightseeing in each city.
- Key attractions include Bratislava Castle, Prague Castle, Dachau Concentration Camp Memorial Site, and the Porsche Factory Museum.

Inclusions and Exclusions

- Included in the program fee:
 - Round trip airfare, airport transfers, overnight accommodations with private bathrooms, daily continental breakfast and dinner, and full-time services of an EF Tour Director.
- Not included:
 - Gratuities for guides and drivers, personal insurance, portorage, beverages, lunches, and public transportation during free time.
 - Itinerary Highlights
 - Day 1-2: Arrival in Budapest, welcome dinner, and a walking tour featuring key landmarks like the Parliament and Fishermen's Bastion.
 - Day 3: Guided sightseeing in Budapest, including Castle Hill and the Royal Palace, with an optional visit to the Széchenyi Thermal Bath.
 - Day 4: Travel to Bratislava for a food-themed tour and visit to Bratislava Castle.
 - Day 5: Journey to Prague, with a walking tour and optional Czech Folklore Evening.
 - Day 6: Explore Prague Castle and the Old Town, including the famous astronomical clock.

- Day 7-8: Travel to Munich, visit the Dachau Memorial, and enjoy guided sightseeing of the city, including Marienplatz and the English Garden.
- Day 9-11 (Optional Extension): Visit Stuttgart and the Porsche Factory Museum, followed by guided sightseeing in Heidelberg, including the historic university and castle.
- School Success Plan

Literacy:

Based on the Mass Casualty Commission's Recommendation, the EECDC has determined that students require direct and specific exposure to and education regarding gender-based violence and its ramifications through selected and vetted resources. The new outcomes and resources for English Language Arts classes for Grades 10 - 12 require intentional teaching and inclusion by teachers as students are not yet familiar with them. These new outcomes and materials connect directly to our Cycle 4 SSP Literacy work from May and June 2025, which focused on the use of thinking routines to expand perspective and understanding of diverse experiences and points of view.

Strategy/Action

Develop students' ability to critically analyze texts, including fiction, non-fiction, and media, to understand how gender-based violence and related issues are represented, challenged, and intersect.

Math:

Results of the final assessments in June in Grades 10 and 11 showed that students are not retaining prior knowledge. Their exam results were well below the grades they were scoring on smaller unit assessments in class.

- Grade 10: 96.5% scored lower on the exam
- Grade 11: 94% scored lower on the exam

Anecdotally, teachers are also observing that students are not retaining prior knowledge from unit to unit or grade to grade (ex: operations with fractions, factoring, etc)

Strategy/Action

Teachers will incorporate activities to help students engage with the prior concepts more often so that they can become more proficient at retrieval. Strategies might include:

- Use interleaved/mixed practice so students need to determine the mathematics to use.
- Use a variety of retrieval strategies on a regular basis to keep concepts familiar to students from previous and current grade levels. (Weekly Retrieval Grids - Grade 10)
- Provide authentic problem-solving experiences that use a variety of mathematics.
- Provide opportunities and exposure for mixed reviews for multiple units/topics.
- Provide opportunities for varied and engaging practice such as scavenger hunts, pixel art activities, self checking activities, etc.
- Provide problems that require students to access multiple mathematical concepts.

Well-Being:

Survey Data feedback from students:

- 14 % of students who responded (188 Of 1120) said they did not have an adult at BVHS they would seek out in a crisis.
