Monday was “Anything But A Backpack Day”, Tuesday was international women’s day where everyone wore purple and pink & there were free sanitary products around the school in various locations. Wednesday was School Spirit day where everyone wore our new colours and we unveiled our “temporary” inflatable shark mascot. Thursday we celebrated St. Patrick’s Day by wearing green and hiding gold coins around the school for everyone to find to turn in for a prize, which happened to be very successful. We then ended the spirit week with a classic PJ day. We also recognized “World Down Syndrome Day” by wearing different coloured socks and “Epilepsy Day” by wearing purple.
